

# CATALYTIC ACTIONS FOR THE AU-ILO-IOM-ECA JOINT PROGRAMME ON LABOUR MIGRATION GOVERNANCE FOR DEVELOPMENT AND INTEGRATION IN AFRICA

The AU-ILO-IOM-ECA Joint Programme on Labour Migration Governance for Development and Integration in Africa (JLMP) is a long term, 10-year joint undertaking among the partner organizations, in coordination with other relevant actors operating in Africa. JLMP is also the mechanism dedicated to the implementation of the African Union (AU) Assembly's 5th Key Priority Area of the Declaration and Plan of Action on Employment, Poverty Eradication and Inclusive Development, namely (AU/Assembly/AU/20(XXIV)/Annex 3, January 2015).

JLMP focuses on intra-African labour migration and supports the achievements of the First Ten Year Plan of the African Union (AU) Agenda 2063 (2013-2023), and targets laid out by the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). JLMP is also responsible for implementing components of the <u>Migration Policy Framework for Africa (MPFA) and Plan of Action (2018-2030)</u> adopted by the AU Executive Council.

The JLMP Action is committed to intra-African labour migration and the challenges African migrant workers face in and outside the continent. It aims at consolidating the key achievements of the JLMP over the past 4 years and expanding to new regions through interventions at regional and national levels, complementing ongoing projects at continental and regional levels, including the Switzerland Strategy for Sub-Saharan Africa (2021-2024). It aims to accelerate implementation of the JLMP and the achievement of additional outcomes.

# JLMP ACTION — CORE PILLARS & GOVERNANCE

## **Core Pillars**

- 1. Support to selected MS and RECs on labour migration governance and regulation for women and men migrant workers in Africa.
- 2. Support to women and men migrant workers to access social protection and mutual recognition of skills and educational levels.
- 3. Support to evidence-based labour migration management through increased utilization of labour migration disaggregated data and statistics, and
- 4. Support to steering, coordination and implementation of labour migration issues and the JLMP, with capacity building as a cross-cutting approach.

- Actions of ILO and IOM will be implemented within 36-months and not go to the fourth year to allow AUC project takeover.

# Start-up Phase (June – August 2021)

- Recruitment of staff.
- Mobilization and information sharing.
- Fine tuning of action plans.
- Development of ToRs for activities.
- Fine tuning communication, M&E & reporting tools.

## The Cruise Phase (Sept. 2021—July 2024)

- Intense implementation of identified activities.
- Workplans jointly developed at the end of each year in collaboration with target groups and stakeholders and updated after 6 months.
- Independent mid-term evaluation conducted.

# Learning & Step-up Phase (August - Dec. 2024)

- Focus on lessons learning activities and capitalization.
- Final evaluation.

- Design of the next project cycle.
